

CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR JANUARY 2018

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for January, 2018. These numbers were generated by conducting a survey of retail prices for a basket of household consumption goods and services, during the second and third weeks of the month under review. The prices were obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones spread across Nairobi and 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 1.32 per cent from 183.05 in December 2017 to 185.47 in January 2018. The overall year on year inflation stood at 4.83 per cent in January 2018.

Between December 2017 and January 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.69 per cent mainly due to increases in prices of some

foodstuffs which outweighed the falls in others. The year on year food inflation increased from 4.68 per cent in December 2017 to 4.71 per cent in January 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.90 per cent in January 2018 compared to December 2017. This was attributed to slight increases in prices house of rents, electricity, charcoal and kerosene as indicated in Table 3.

During the same review period, the Transport Index recorded an increase of 1.53 per cent on account of increase in pump prices of both petrol and diesel.



CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR FEBRUARY 2018

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for February, 2018. These numbers were generated by conducting a survey of retail prices for a basket of household consumption goods and services, during the second and third weeks of the month under review. The prices were obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones spread across Nairobi and 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 1.36 per cent from 185.47 in January 2018 to 188.00 in February 2018. The overall year on year inflation stood at 4.46 per cent in February 2018.

Between January and February 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 2.22 per cent which was higher than the 1.69 per cent recorded between December 2017 and January 2018. This was mainly due to increases in prices of some foodstuffs as a result of drought conditions currently being experienced in some parts of the country. The year on year food inflation however, decreased from 4.71 per cent in January 2018 to 3.83 per cent in February 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.41 per cent in January 2018 compared to February 2018. As indicated in Table 3, this was mainly attributed to small increases in prices of house rents and cooking fuels.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 0.84 per cent mainly on account of increase in pump prices of both petrol and diesel.



CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR MARCH 2018

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for March, 2018. These numbers were generated by conducting a survey of retail prices for a basket of household consumption goods and services, during the second and third weeks of the month under review. The prices were obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones spread across Nairobi and 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 1.39 per cent from 188.00 in February 2018 to 190.62 in March 2018. The overall year on year inflation stood at 4.18 per cent in March 2018.

Between February and March 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.54 per cent. This was mainly due to increase in prices of some foodstuffs which outweighed decreases recorded in respect to others. The year on year food inflation however, decreased from 3.83 per cent in February 2018 to 2.19 per cent in March 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 3.78 per cent in March 2018 compared to February 2018. As indicated in Table 3, this was mainly attributed to significant increase in prices of cooking fuels. Notable, charcoal recorded a 27.1 per cent increase in price during the review period. The rise in the cost of electricity was attributed to rise in fuel cost adjustment charges per KWh of consumption.

During the same review period, the Transport Index decreased by 0.06 per cent mainly on account of reduction in pump prices of petrol.



CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR APRIL 2018

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for April, 2018. These numbers were generated by conducting a survey of retail prices for a basket of household consumption goods and services, during the second and third weeks of the month under review. The prices were obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones spread across Nairobi and 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 1.35 per cent from 190.62 in March 2018 to 193.18 in April 2018. The overall year on year inflation stood at 3.73 per cent in April 2018.

Between March and April 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.59 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to increase in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing decreases recorded in respect of others. The year on year food inflation however, decreased from 2.19 per cent in March 2018 to 0.26 per cent in April 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 3.24 per cent in April 2018 compared to 3.78 per cent in March 2018. This was mainly attributed to significant increase in prices of cooking fuels with charcoal recording the highest increase of 16.87 per cent.

During the same review period, the Transport Index decreased by 0.16 per cent mainly on account of reduction in pump prices of petrol and diesel.



CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR MAY 2018

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for May, 2018. These numbers were generated by conducting a survey of retail prices for a basket of household consumption goods and services, during the second and third weeks of the month under review. The prices were obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones in Nairobi and 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 0.97 per cent from 193.18 in April 2018 to 195.05 in May 2018. The overall year on year inflation stood at 3.95 per cent in May 2018.

Between April and May 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.35 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to increase in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing decreases recorded in respect of others. The year on year food inflation however, increased from 0.26 per cent in April 2018 to 0.34 per cent in May 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 1.79 per cent in May 2018 compared to 3.24 per cent in April 2018. This was mainly attributed to increase in prices of cooking fuels with charcoal recording the highest increase of 9.66 per cent.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 0.10 per cent mainly on account of increase in the pump price of petrol which outweighed decrease in diesel prices.



CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR JUNE 2018

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for June, 2018. These numbers were generated from a survey of retail prices that targeted a basket of household consumption goods and services. The survey was conducted during the second and third weeks of the month, with prices being obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones in Nairobi and in 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI decreased by 0.89 per cent from 195.05 in May 2018 to 193.31 in June 2018. The overall year on year inflation stood at 4.28 per cent in June 2018.

Between May and June 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index decreased by 2.20 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to decrease in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing increases recorded in respect of others. The year on year food inflation similarly, decreased from 1.35 per cent in May 2018 to 0.9 per cent in June 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.52 per cent in June 2018 compared to 1.79 per cent recorded in May 2018. This was mainly attributed to significant increase in prices of kerosene and charcoal which outweighed decreases in electricity charges.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 0.37 per cent mainly on account of increase in the pump price of petrol and diesel.

Between June and July 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index decreased by 2.40 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to decrease in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing increases recorded in respect of others. The year on year food inflation similarly, decreased from 0.9 per cent in June 2018 to 0.53 per cent in July 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.12 per cent in July 2018 compared to 0.52 per cent recorded in June 2018. This was mainly attributed to increase in prices of kerosene, electricity and cooking gas.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 0.62 per cent mainly on account of increase in the pump price of petrol which outweighed decrease in price of diesel.

Between July and August 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index decreased by 0.66 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to decrease in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing increases recorded in respect of others. This decrease was greatly contributed by fall in prices of maize grains. The year on year food inflation consequently, decreased from 0.53 per cent in July 2018 to a negative 1.15 per cent in August 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 2.56 per cent in August 2018 compared to 0.12 per cent recorded in July 2018. This was mainly attributed to a significant increase in prices of electricity which rose by 52.8 per cent and 6.6 per cent for 50 and 200 KWh respectively. The year on year inflation for the group similarly increased significantly by 16.7 per cent over the period.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 0.87 per cent mainly on account of increase in the pump price of petrol which outweighed decrease in price of diesel.

Between August and September 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 0.37 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to increase in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing decreases recorded in respect of others. This increase in the food index was greatly neutralized by recent fall in prices of maize grain and related products. The year on year food inflation, increased from negative 1.15 per cent in August 2018 to a positive 0.50 per cent in September 2018.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.47 per cent in September 2018 compared to August 2018. Further, the index was 7.29 per cent higher than in September 2017, mainly on account of review of tariff structure for electricity.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 7.99 per cent compared to the previous month, and 17.29 per cent compared to same month in 2017. This was mainly on account of increase in the pump prices of petrol and diesel which triggered increase in prices of other transport components.

Between September and October 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index declined by 1.76 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, the decrease was mainly due to lower prices of maize and maize products compared to previous month.

The price of a 2 kilogramme packet of sifted maize flour dropped by 14.4 per cent from an average of KSh 97.88 in September 2018 to KSh 83.83 in October 2018. During the same period, prices of various vegetables were lower in October 2018 than September 2018. The year on year food inflation was 0.52 per cent in October.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.20 per cent in October 2018. The rise in the index was due to increase in house rents. However, cost of electricity was lower in October 2018 than in September 2018.

During the same review period, the Transport Index decreased by 0.86 per cent mainly due to a drop in petrol prices.

Between October and November 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index decreased by 0.15 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to decrease in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing increases recorded in others. For instance, the price of sugar and cabbages declined by 2.2 per cent and 4.4 per cent, respectively, compared with last month. The year on year food inflation in November, 2018 was 1.72 per cent.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, decreased by 1.24 per cent in November 2018 compared to October 2018. The drop was mainly due to lower costs in prices of electricity consumption. The consumption of 50 KWh of electricity declined by 31.4 per cent from KSh 1,105 in October 2018 to KSh 758 in November.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 0.81 per cent compared to the previous month. This was mainly on account of increase in the pump prices of petrol and public transport fares. However, the price of diesel dropped from an average of KSh 110.57 in October to KSh 108.97 in November 2018.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 0.65 per cent from 192.25 in November 2018 to 193.51 in December 2018. The overall year on year inflation in December stood at 5.71 per cent.

Between November and December 2018, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.05 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, this was due to increase in prices of some foodstuffs outweighing decreases recorded in respect of others. Consequently, the year on year food inflation in December, 2018 stood at 2.54 per cent.

Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.07 per cent in December 2018 compared to November 2018. However, the cost of household electricity consumption for 50 as well as for 200 KWh remained at the same level as in November 2017.

During the same review period, the Transport Index increased by 1.34 per cent, mainly on account of increase in local and international flight charges as well as bus and *matatu* fares. The upsurge in the transport, food, clothing and foot ware prices was attributed to increased demand that was associated to Christmas festivities.



CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR JANUARY 2019

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for January, 2019. These numbers were generated from a survey of retail prices that targeted a basket of household consumption goods and services. The exercise was conducted during the second and third weeks of the month, with prices being obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones in Nairobi and in 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 0.35 per cent from 193.51 in December 2018 to 194.18 in January 2019. The overall year on year inflation in January 2019 stood at 4.70 per cent.

Between December 2018 and January 2019, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 0.78 per cent, while the year on year food inflation stood at 1.62 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, the cost of several foodstuffs in January 2019 was much lower compared to the same period of the previous year. For instance, maize grain recorded a drop of 40.6 per cent from KSh 59.90 per kilogram in January 2018 to KSh 35.25 in January 2019. Similarly, the prices of sifted maize flour, sugar and beans declined by 29.04, 7.69 and 6.08 per cent, respectively. These lower prices contributed to the overall low inflation in January 2019.

Over the same period, the Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.20 per cent as a result of higher cost of house rents and cooking fuels. Partly contributing to this, were prices of domestic electricity consumption for 50 Kwh as well as for 200 KWh which increased by 1.68 and 1.15 per cent, respectively, attributed to increase in foreign and inflation adjustment charges.

The Transport Index decreased by 1.40 per cent, mainly due to decreases in pump prices of petrol and diesel.



CONSUMER PRICE INDICES AND INFLATION RATES FOR FEBRUARY 2019

Kenya National Bureau of Statistics hereby releases monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) and rates of inflation, for February, 2019. These numbers were generated from a survey of retail prices that targeted a basket of household consumption goods and services. The exercise was conducted during the second and third weeks of the month, with prices being obtained from selected retail outlets in 25 data collection zones in Nairobi and in 13 other urban centers.

As shown in Tables 1 and 2, the CPI increased by 0.82 per cent from 194.18 in January 2019 to 195.78 in February 2019. The overall year on year inflation in February 2019 stood at 4.14 per cent.

Between January and February 2019, Food and Non-Alcoholic Drinks' Index increased by 1.70 per cent. As indicated in Table 3, the cost of several foodstuffs in February 2019 was much lower compared to the same period of the previous year. For instance, maize grain

recorded a drop of 41.0 per cent from Ksh.60.37 per kilogramme in February 2018 to Ksh.35.63 in February 2019. Similarly, the prices of sifted maize flour, spinach and tomatoes declined by 30.68, 20.66 and 16.63 per cent, respectively. These lower prices contributed to a relatively low overall inflation in February 2019.

The Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels' Index, increased by 0.12 per cent in February compared to January 2019. This resulted from higher cost of some house rents and some cooking fuels. Partly contributing to this, were prices of domestic consumption of electricity which increased by 2.48 and 1.70 per cent for 50 Kwh and 200 KWh, respectively on account of increase in fuel cost and inflation adjustment charges.

The Transport Index decreased by 0.50 per cent, mainly as a result of significant decreases in pump prices of petrol and diesel.
