## MAXIMUM RETAIL PUMP PRICES OF PETROLEUM

In accordance with Legal Notice No.196, The Energy (Petroleum Pricing) Regulations, 2010, the Energy Regulatory Commission (ERC) has calculated the maximum retail pump prices of petroleum products which will be in force from 15th February to 14th March 2011.

During the month of January 2011, the international prices of crude oil and refined petroleum products continued on an upward trend which started in July 2010. The political instability being experienced in North Africa has continued to exert pressures on international oil prices. The Free On Board price for Murban crude oil lifted in January 2011 was posted at US Dollars 95.55 per barrel, an increase of 4% from US Dollars 91.85 per barrel in December 2010.

The average cost of imported super petrol increased by 9.5% from US Dollars 862.73 per metric ton in December 2010 to US Dollars 944.62 per metric ton in January 2011. Over the same period the average cost of imported Diesel increased by 7.4% from US dollars 784.02 per metric ton to US Dollars 841.79 per metric ton while the average cost of imported Kerosene increased by 9.1% from US Dollars 841.18 per metric ton in December 2010 to US Dollars 917.61 per metric ton in January 2011.

When the impacts of the above changes are incorporated in the formula for calculating the maximum retail pump prices the overall effect is an increase of between KES 0.94 and KES 3.00 per litre, for the products under review, from the prices published last month. The increases for the individual products as at Mombasa are as follows:

Super Petrol: Kenya shillings 2.40 per litre (an increase of 2.6 %)
Regular Petrol: Kenya shillings 0.94 per litre (an increase of 1.0 %)
Kerosene: Kenya shillings 2.01 per litre (an increase of 2.7 %)
Diesel: Kenya shillings 3.00 per litre (an increase of 3.5%)

The attached is a schedule of the maximum retail pump prices for selected towns in the country.
