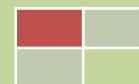

## **FOREWORD**

This is the 2005/2006 Edition of the Annual Statistical Digest. It is an updated and expanded version prepared by Statistics Sierra Leone in concert with Government Ministries /Departments and Non-Governmental Organizations.

The 2005/2006 Digest presents in a concise and readily accessible form, important statistical information on the demographic, economic and social characteristics of Sierra Leone. Four new topics have been added: Tourism, Construction, Poverty and the Millennium Development Goals/Indicators.

All data in this edition are the latest available as at the time of compilation. Figures in each issue of the Digest supersede and replace those appearing in previous editions.

Where necessary, figures have been reported to the nearest digit, and hence in some tables, there may be slight discrepancies between the sum of the items and the total given.

It is hoped that this expanded edition will be useful to a wide range of users, policy makers, planners and the general public.

We are grateful to all public and private institutions that provided the data requested within reasonable time for final compilation and publication.
